

BLAKENEY BRIDGE REPORT #PW-05-2023

Public Works Committee March 22, 2023 Sean Derouin, Public Works Manager

BACKGROUND

• 2022:

- Council voted to complete an Enhanced Inspection on the bridge and undergo an EA assessment in 2023 based on the results of the memo provided by Keystone Bridge Management on the deteriorating condition of the bridge.
- Enhanced inspection completed during low flow. Report recommended reducing load posting to 5 tonnes and replacing the bridge as soon as possible.
- Repairs completed to bridge and load posting returned to 12 tonnes.
- A PIC was held on December 1 in Almonte. Approximately 40 people attended, which included 2 distinguishable groups:
 - 1. Residents of Blakeney with preference for single lane bridge including traffic signals for traffic calming purposes; and
 - 2. Representatives of the local agriculture community that preferred the two-lane bridge to better accommodate wide farm equipment.
- Council, at their meeting held on December 14, 2022, with consideration for future development and traffic demand, unanimously voted to proceed with a two-lane 7.3m wide replacement modular panel bridge in 2023.

BACKGROUND

January 25, 2023 Public Works Committee Meeting

Adopted Motion:

THAT, Council receive the new information related to the Blakeney Bridge Reconstruction; and

AND THAT, Council direct staff to proceed with replacing Blakeney Bridge in 2024 with a 7.3m modular panel bridge,

AND THAT, Council direct staff to proceed with an RFP to complete a bridge replacement design alternative report, to be presented to the Public Works Committee in March.



- An RFP for the Bridge Replacement Design Alternatives Report was advertised on MERX and closed on January 31, 2023.
- 7 proposals were received ranging in price from \$10K to \$180K, with 5 of 7 under \$30K.
- Jewell Engineering (currently completing Andrewsville Bridge EA Study) was evaluated the highest score at a cost \$9,990.
- Jewell was able to meet the strict timelines and provided the bridge replacement alternatives report, see Appendix A.



Alternative Bridge Span Arrangements Considered

- The following bridge arrangements were assessed to determine the most cost effect solution:
 - 1. a 90' bridge and a 150' bridge (as presented in December)
 - 2. a 90' bridge and a 160' bridge with a pier at midpoint
 - (i.e. 90' & 80'-80')
 - 3. Two 90' bridges, and a 50' bridge, same as current configuration but with no piers.
 - 4. a 180' bridge and a 130' bridge, spanning both islands.
- It was determined that Option 1 was the most feasible span arrangement.



Pedestrian Crossing

- The following pedestrian crossing scenarios were assessed:
 - A. Two-Lane bridge with no Pedestrian Crossing
 - B. Two-Lane bridge with a Pedestrian Crossing
 - C. Two-Lane bridge, operated as a single lane bridge with interim traffic signals, with trusses that have been upsized to accommodate a future cantilevered pedestrian platform



Next Steps:

- Council decides on proceeding with pedestrian platform or not, then:
 - PW proceeds with advertising an RFP for the detailed design of the replacement bridge;
 - PW proceeds with an RFP for the supply of the bridge;
 - PW proceed with the MCEA process, including hosting a second PIC either virtually or in person to update the public on the chosen option moving forward.



ANALYSIS AND OPTIONS

- Options to consider:
 - A. Do not install a pedestrian crossing, proceed as previously approved.
 - B. Install a pedestrian crossing now.
 - C. Operate Bridge as a single lane with interim traffic signals and pedestrian safety measures and install a pedestrian platform in the future when the traffic demand warrants.



FINANCIAL IMPACT

- Option A: No Pedestrian Crossing
 - ~\$3.85M
- Option B: Pedestrian Crossing
 - ~\$4.23M
- Option C: Future Pedestrian Crossing with interim traffic signals and other measures
 - ~\$4.21M
 - Additional cost to install the pedestrian walkway in the future ~\$600K.
- Original approved budget= \$4.5M
- Note: only costs associated with the Option 1 span arrangement are provided.
- Costs include estimated engineering and contract administration.
- Additional cost to install pedestrian walkway now= \$380KANARK

LOCAL MUNICIPAL IMPACT

 The current approved option of a two-lane bridge does not accommodate pedestrians.

RECOMMENDED MOTION

That Council direct staff to proceed with replacing Blakeney Bridge with Option B: Two-Lane modular panel bridge with a cantilevered pedestrian crossing; and

That Council direct staff to seek funding from the Municipality of Mississippi Mills to cover the additional costs of the pedestrian platform, which is estimated to be \$380K.
